## Guide for letting Sydney Water know you support Option W.

We are hoping that you are coping well enough with the COVID restrictions, and wouldn't mind something new to do....So, here's a request from OCU campaigner Peter Stevens to take a Covid-safe action to support the OCU campaign. It's intended to provide visual evidence of your commitment and of the range of ways we relate to the Wolli bushland. And to be a bit of fun at the same time, so don't think it needs to be elaborate.

Four easy steps with, below, some examples of the creativity of Wolli Creek Preservation Society members who've already done this:

- 1 Make an easily read sign about what you do in, or how you relate to the bushland, such as "I'm a regular walker on the Two Valley Trail" (several other possibilities listed below\*). Keep it brief. The size is just to make the message readable in the photo. And don't be bound by this see examples below
- 2 Finish with a separate line "I'm for Option W" or similar. (Option W is explained in a letter and attachments to the Minister at <u>http://www.wollicreek.org.au/wp-content/wolliupload/Option-W-210731.pdf</u> and is our alternative proposal about the OCU location.)
- 3 Be photographed with your sign. Add whatever decoration, background, props, you feel like to make your point. You might just hold it up, have it alongside, seen in a mirror or whatever be inventive, it's meant to be fun.
- Email the shot (no other message needed)

and be inventive about your sign - there are lots of things that could serve as your sign - here's a quick sample, go where you fancy takes you, brainstorm with your singles buddy or household.....

- An old cornflake packet deconstructed and reversed or a large sheet of paper or cardboard;
- lipstick on a mirror;
- a manilla folder or an A4 flat envelope, opened out;
- a piece of light-coloured fabric,
- a pair of old undies or a singlet......
- put your message over the picture with a bit of image manipulation.
